

Noel's Story


Before coming to the Friendship House, Noel was homeless and living on the streets, spending long hours with nothing to look forward to. One day, as she sat on the sidewalk, a police officer approached—not with demands or warnings, but with a question:

"Do you want to do something different today instead of just sit here?"

Looking around, she thought, "There has to be something better than this." It felt like a miracle when she answered, "Sure. I'll try something different." That ves changed everything.

The officer brought Noel to the Friendship House, the Union Gospel Mission's women and children's shelter. At first, she wasn't sure if she'd fit in, but the staff made her feel welcome.

Soon after, the Women's Director, Colleen, shared the love of Jesus and prayed with her. That night, Noel gave her life to Christ.



Now, Noel is part of the Mission's one-year New Foundation Discipleship program and BCF Bible study training. "I'm learning to look at myself, analyze my past, and stop hurtful behaviors. My mindset is changing—if I keep doing the same bad behavior, nothing will change," she says.

There was a time she thought God had abandoned her. She remembers sitting on a hotel bed saying, "God, how come you just left me? I felt forsaken. But now I know—He never did."

Her mindset has changed. She no longer wakes up worrying about cigarettes, money, or where she might sleep. She has found something better.

She has found Jesus.

Noel now works in the Friendship House clothing bank, helping others in need. She dreams of becoming a Sunday school teacher or counselor to share the hope she has found.

She takes comfort in scripture, especially Psalm 27:1:

"The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom should I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom should I be afraid?"

"God saved me from my troubled life. I never want to go back. Now, I have a better future."
